usually keep my monthly message short and sweet. But as I look back on 2017, I am simply amazed by God's favor, and cannot write enough about what He has done! Just take a look at the following blessings:

- Six amazing graduations took place, involving over 50 graduates, who now have abundant lives that the Lord always had waiting for them! Keynote Speakers included Bishop Stephen Blaire, San Joaquin District Attorney Tori Verber-Salazar, Former Stockton Mayor and Stockton Rotary Chairperson Ann Johnston, Quail Lakes Baptist Church Senior Pastor Dr. Marc Maffucci, and Stockton Chief of Police Eric Jones.
- Our New Life Program Scholarship Gala in April funded six life-changing student scholarships. The Keynote Speaker was John Ashmen, President of the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions.
- Our Food Service trade school launched in May, where our Students can earn California Food Handlers Certificates.
- The Grand Opening of the Recuperative Care Center took place in June, resulting in program expansion from 6 to 22 clients. This is the only free non-profit Recuperative Care program in San Joaquin County, and serves homeless people transitioning out of a hospital.
- A suspected arson fire in June suspended our free Clothing Plus Ministry for four months and affected our Payee Services Ministry and Administration staff for several weeks. Through your generosity and the Love Stockton community service event in September, which brought over 300 volunteers to our campus, the Lord made our Administration Building into a nicer facility than it was before!
- GCRM went from a 20% to 40% self-funding organization through several service fee, micro-enterprise, or cause related marketing programs.

- In partnering with Lincoln Center, GCRM established the first Cause-Related Marketing Partnership within the 300 Association of Gospel Rescue Missions across North America.
- The long-vacant, 3-story Alustiza Building renovation towards transitional and permanent housing for women and children began! This past summer, RB Environmental, led by Founder Ron Barber, completed the first of five phases by removing the hazardous material from the building.
- Through GCRM's new non-profit training ministry, over 50 local and 50 North American non-profits were trained in fundraising and recuperative care this past year.
- GCRM had amazing media coverage last year, which included: The launch of our monthly newsletter, The Vision, with the help of SASS! Public Relations; several Stockton Record articles; numerous press releases; national coverage in the Association of Gospel Rescue Missions' RESCUE Magazine; Love Stockton coverage by KXVS Voice of Stockton, KYCC Your Christian Companion, and 105.9 The Bull; a CBS segment about our three-generation family on campus; Lincoln Center Chronicle feature on GCRM; all-day coverage on K-Love Radio; an NBC segment of one of our graduations; and so much more.
