changing decision needed to be made. Laurie had come to a major crossroad in her life. At the suggestion of a friend, who had successfully completed the New Life Program at Gospel Center Rescue Mission, Laurie felt this was her best option to avoid prison. Little did she know this decision would provide a life changing experience in ways not imagined in Laurie's previous life. Not only did participation in the program keep her out of jail, it provided a venue to free Laurie from drug addiction. While the Mission continued to work on Laurie's outward problems, a greater

and unexpected benefit was taking place within her spiritual self. Laurie was being introduced to the forgiving grace of Jesus Christ.

In her younger years belief in God was a foreign and abstract concept – because Laurie's thinking was a loving God would never let a father die and be taken from a child. A great bitterness kept her from seeking any type of spiritual relationship. This was about to change.

As her time at the Mission commenced, she experienced the programs, counseling, relationships

with staff and fellow students and those Sunday bus trips to church. Soon, the Holy Spirit began working in Laurie by changing her heart and opening her life to unexpected joy. A relationship with her Savior brought new meaning to Laurie's life that had been so shattered and devoid of meaningful purpose. Jesus opened not only her heart but also personal doors which were bolted for many years.

"My life is renewed. I am back in relationship with my children and grandchildren, enjoying the simple

things in life that once were overshadowed by my addiction. The Gospel Center is a wonderful place with a wonderful program. The work they do is life-changing." Laurie is currently employed at the Mission serving as House Manager in the Women's and Family Shelter, with goals of living independently outside the Mission.

Laurie's success is one of outward and inner change. It encompasses a desire to mend and seek out the truth to life. Even though her journey has been filled with many challenges, Laurie's advice is succinct, "If I can complete this program, anyone can."
