One of the many things I was reminded of during my recent time with family, was the fact that I was raised by Godly parents who instilled high-quality values and life skills. This month's cover story about our Mission Kids brings to light just how important it is for parents to teach children proper values and skills they will carry with them their entire lives. New Life Program (NLP) Students, both with and without children, learn many invaluable lessons throughout their time at the Mission that they may then pass on to younger generations. So how does the NLP address values and life skills for parents? Here are just a few ways:

- Adverse Childhood Experiences training that identifies the effects on the mind, body and soul as a result of early childhood trauma parents may have gone through. Then individualized counseling follows.
- Classes on anger management, relapse prevention, setting boundaries, and caring for others through biblical teaching.
- Life Skills training such as ServeSafe Food Handler's Certificate and other skills through a comprehensive "Ministry Assignment" program that makes each NLP Student part of our Staff-led, Student-run Rescue Mission.
- Parenting activities such as attending Church where Sunday School is available for children or being a parent chaperon as part of their Kid's Summer Program where there is a fun activity at least once a week off Campus.
- Individualized education focused on math and English improvement.

- A New Life Scholarship Program that links individuals like YOU who can be encouragers and mentors for these parents (and children). As an example, parents can see what a healthy home and marriage looks like through their scholar sponsors.
- And most importantly, the beginning or renewal of a relationship with the Lord where parents can now teach their children biblical principles. To this point, I am reminded of Proverbs 22:6 which states:

Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it.

May God bless and train our parents to be good leaders for their children through the New Life Program!
