

FUNDING OPPORTUNITY: Emergency Lodging

DESCRIPTION: The Emergency Lodging Program meets the physical and spiritual nightly housing needs of up to 100 homeless men, women, and children from the surrounding communities of San Joaquin County. Overnight guests receive dinner and breakfast before departing in the morning. Clothing is available to those in need. Clothing is free of charge with no income verification. Guests enjoy optional nightly chapel services put on by local churches

who declare God's forgiving grace through traditional and contemporary services.

Additionally, during the daytime, the Rescue Mission operates a safe place, known as the "Courtyard", for individuals to come rest, fellowship, use a public bathroom, and get drinking water. Individuals may rent a locker for \$12.00 per month which gives them a place to secure personal items.



BENEFIT: Guests may apply for admission into the New Life Program. (See separate description within the PROGRAMS or NEW LIFE PROGRAM FUNDING OPPORTUNITY.) Emergency Lodging's sole purpose is to transition the homeless on a pathway to permanent housing or other services where mental illness or severe physical handicap conditions exist.

COST: Personnel, (our Housemen and Housewomen) meals, clothing, supplies, and maintenance and equipping of two separate dorms for 100 nightly guests and the operation of the Homeless Courtyard is estimated to cost \$30,000/month or \$360,000/annually.
