The green represents two things: a tree and a crown of jewels. The tree symbolizes new life and revitalization. The jewels represent that we are part of God's Kingdom. *"They are like trees planted along the riverbank, bearing fruit each season. Their leaves never wither, and they prosper in all they do." – Psalm 1:3 (NLT)*

The cross is strategically placed at the center of our logo to show that Jesus is the center of the Gospel Center Rescue Mission.

"May I never boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, through which the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world." – Galatians 6:14 (NIV)



Similarly to the green, the teal in the Gospel Center Rescue Mission name represents God's creation and life as well, but this time as air, water and the sky.

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. Now the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters." – Genesis 1:1-2 (NIV)

The purple lines symbolize that we are the King's Kids and we are royalty. We have purple lines painted on the entrances and exits of our campus as a reminder that those who are born again in Christ are the King's Kids; our attitudes and outlooks should reflect that and be the same as Jesus.

The Grand Re-Opening and Ribbon Cutting of The New Hope Family Shelter was held under a large tent in the Brown Building Courtyard.






The Ribbon Cutting Celebration for the Women's Gym in the New Hope Family Shelter was held on April 21st.
