# Gratitude Growth

The Gospel Center Rescue Mission is more than a bed and a warm meal. It is a respite, a place of peace, a haven and sanctuary where the love and grace of Jesus changes hearts and rebuilds lives. It is because of you, our partners and sponsors, who know and believe that the power of God's grace and forgiveness will change people. The life story of Jamie Lee Watson, just 36 years old, is an example of the power of Jesus working in the lives of those who come to The Mission.

From the age of four, Jamie can remember the physical and psychological abuse she had endured. Born into a family of alcoholism, drugs, and violence, she describes her life as a 'rain of violence'. Throughout her childhood, she felt abandoned and worthless and by the age of 13 she quit school and began a life of alcohol and drugs. She found herself living on the streets, in abusive relationships, never sober, and at age 17 pregnant with her first baby, which was taken from her at birth. Over the next twelve years, as Jamie continued her life on the streets – she had five more children – who were all taken away from her by CPS and eventually adopted. When she was in a relationship with someone drugs and alcohol continued to fuel the abuse.

Jamie's life was the streets. She was always high and didn't trust anyone. She then met Gary, who later became her spouse. Her years of abuse created issues of trust and inadequacy, yet after one year of encouragement from him, she began to feel a tug in her heart and finally said, "I need help".

After a 14-day stay at a Community Medical Centers detox facility, she reluctantly came to The Mission! Jamie really struggled for three months. She said she could feel the spiritual battle between God and the devil. Jamie firmly believes that God's hand, and the prayers and support from staff, kept her at The Mission. Jamie said, "I was holding onto my mustard seed of

## We Need Your Help...

Thank you for your partnerships and financial support to serve the millions of people who have stepped through our gates. We could not have done it without you, and we still cannot do it without you. While local government agencies are covering the entire overhead cost of another shelter for the homeless in our community, they are not even helping with one half month of what it costs us to operate our New Life Program. We too, need help! Support of The Mission and our New Life Program helps transform our students by giving them tools for life beyond The Mission, and become healthy contributors to society.

We need to raise \$400,000.00 to get us through the slow months of the summer and into the fall, as soon as possible. If one thousand people gave \$400.00 dollars we would be covered. Please be in prayer with us about this need. Below are a couple

ways to give, that will help us out through the end of the year.

- New Life Program Scholarships: You can sponsor one (or more!) students that are working hard to turn their lives around in our New Life Program (NLP). Providing a scholarship to an NLP student lets them know that somebody from the outside world cares about them and wants to see them succeed and believes in them that they can succeed. \$5,000 covers the first phase (6 months) for a student in the program. There are a total of three phases, phase one and two are for six months each. Phase three is for one year. Each phase takes them closer to a successful life.
- Unrestricted gifts: Unrestricted gifts can be used for any Mission purpose and would be greatly appreciated to help with our operational expenses.

faith, I asked myself, 'Why am I not allowing myself to grow?' I started a gratitude journal and slowly my life began to change." She began volunteering at The Mission, attending church and school.

"I now work in Recuperative Care at The Mission." Jamie continued, "I love my job. It is teaching me how much patience God gives, the importance of setting boundaries and how to build each other up. Through our Bible studies at The Mission, Jesus is teaching me the fruits of the spirit – and now have a life I thought I'd never had. The whole community of The Mission is amazing, and I am very thankful God put me right here!"

Jamie knows God has a plan for her life. "God is real! He has a great story for me. He lifted me out of evil and is taking away all my bad habits. They are stripped away. I have blossomed and today I know I have a beautiful heart. I came from absolutely nothing, and Jesus is preparing a place for me to be something. I am so thankful for that!"

While at The Mission, Jamie's rain of violence has been replaced with the rain of grace, peace, love, and hope that only Jesus can give. After running for twenty-three years, she is appreciating the beauty of just sitting still to listen to God's voice.
