Just imagine being left behind by both your mother and your father, separated from your siblings and being put into foster care. That is what Laurie Ann Holloway experienced at the early age of five. The next fourteen years she spent bouncing from foster home to foster home. "I never belonged anywhere. I never had a home, or a crew of friends," said Laurie. Since then, Laurie has rekindled her relationship with her dad and her siblings.

Aging out of the foster system, Laurie had nowhere to go. "So, I hit the road - hitch hiking across the United States." She had made it through life on her own and she was determined to not let life get her down. Traversing across the country she would stop, find day-labor, working just long enough to get back on the road again. Just like her childhood, she couldn't stay anywhere very long before life was closing in on her and she moved on. Fending off commitments and relationships, her feet took her wherever she could, trying to find comfort and peace that just couldn't be found.

She thought she had found her ideal life with a new boyfriend. He had a home, a job, and a dog. Although he was a functioning drug addict, paranoid and extremely abusive, she felt she had stability. It was a time when she was experiencing what she thought was 'normal', and had settled in. Then one day he flew into the house stating they needed to leave immediately, and they were on the run again. First to Florida, then to California. Chased by federal authorities they were eventually found in a vineyard. By the grace of God, he was taken by the officials, and she was sent to the Gospel Center Rescue Mission.

That first night at The Mission, she laid there in her bed, totally exhausted, and so relieved. "For the first time in my life I slept peacefully," said Laurie. At The Mission she began to take the classes, absorbing life lessons that she had never been taught. She embraced the Bible Studies and the chapel services. "I never really knew that Jesus knew me. I thought I was invisible. Yet I learned that God was with me through my whole life, from foster care to that day the officials found us in the vineyard. By His grace I was found and sent to The Mission."

Showing a strong interest in getting involved in The Mission programs, Laurie was part of the crew that started Church Street Coffee – The Mission's coffee roasting business. "I learned to roast the coffee beans, bag them and prepare for shipping. My team goes out into the community to sell coffee at events and churches. We are a small start-up but we are starting to grow. This work makes me feel important, especially since the proceeds go right back to the student programs. I care about the students. No one should be left behind and these programs give everyone a second chance in life! I know through Christ I am needed and important to Him."

Laurie shared, "Running Church Street Coffee has given me such purpose. I love learning and it keeps me busy. This has also given me the motivation to complete my GED, and the opportunity to be an example to others that God changes lives."

She continued, "I am grateful to be alive and to be at The Mission. I am thankful for the programs and the growth I have experienced. During my 39 years, I have walked a long, horrible road. Yet, I know that because of His love for me, right now, I am here – just where He wants me to be."
